THE PASCHAL TRIDUUM, often called the EASTER TRIDUUM or simply the TRIDUUM, consists of HOLY THURSDAY, GOOD FRIDAY, HOLY SATURDAY, AND EASTER SUNDAY.


This includes the Great Easter Vigil, the high point of the Triduum. The word Triduum comes from the Latin word meaning "three days."

It begins the evening of Maundy Thursday and ends at Evening Prayer on Easter Sunday. Thus, the Triduum consists of three full days which begin and end in the evening.


The Triduum is not part of Lent (at least *liturgically*), but Holy Thursday and Good Friday are still reckoned as part of the traditional forty days of Lent.

The Triduum celebrates the heart of our faith and salvation: the death and resurrection of Christ, and is thus the high point of the liturgical year.



Tuesday of Holy Week




Good Friday
